NASA LUNAR TRAILBLAZ









RSC are working closely with the University of Oxford's Lunar Thermal Mapper (LTM) team, offering expert advice and surface treatment solutions for the NASA Luna Trailblazer project.

RSC have developed a fully bespoke solution that meets the customer's requirements, with the application process being entirely unique to Ramp Surface Coatings. Using a blend of three REACH complaint coatings, the surface treatment meets the high level specialist requirements of Space travel.

Due for completion and launch in 2023, the Lunar Trailblazer is a satellite that will orbit the Moon and detect water on its surface. By doing so, NASA can map areas of water and determine

how its formed, its location and abundance related to the Moons geology. The mission is to better understand lunar water cycles, particularly in the permanently shadowed areas. This data is key to understanding delivery of equipment to the Moon and future exploration.



SENIOR LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



(SLDP)

In March this year the SLDP formed up for the first of 8 training and development modules for 16 senior managers in the FGP Group, representing all departments across the 3 sites.

The aim of the programme is to enhance the performance of these senior managers in their current roles and prepare them to take greater responsibility, to underpin the growth of the business.

Each module takes place on the top floor of the Hunter Building in Weymouth and lasts 5 hours, usually starting at 8 am on a Friday to minimise disruption to the business. The training includes workshops on leadership and management topics, with case studies, discussions, role playing and exercises. The syllabus for the programme is closely related to the way that Nigel and the Directors want to develop the business, giving more freedom and responsibility to senior managers to enhance business performance and agility. So, rather than being an abstract, theoretical leadership course it's very much focused on improving the way the business runs. So far, the modules have covered:

→ Module 1 You, The Leader

→ Module 2 Developing Your People

→ Module 3 Planning for Success

→ Module 4 The Art of Effective Execution

→ Module 5 Strategy Implementation

Module 5 has focused on 5 activities to develop the business over the next 3-5 years. The course has formed 5 project teams each supported by a Director, as mentor, to make a plan for each of the activities. The activities are:

→ Operational Performance Improvement

→ Rationalisation of Plant and Machinery

Innovation and Technology

→ People

→ Infrastructure

Each project has a financial target for contribution to overall Group performance. The project teams are working on their plans and will present them back to the directors at the November meeting.

Once approved these plans will be put into action. They will involve everybody in the business in one way or another.

The SLDP will give individual managers some important practical techniques, strengthen the purpose and cohesion of the senior leadership team and sharpen the business for the next few years.

Programmes like the SLDP set FGP apart from lots of other businesses, so it's a great privilege for me to be involved with you all.


A fantastic day of Celebration once again at FGP's very own Apprentice Awards.




